## VOTING IN NORTH DAKOTA

**If you are a U.S. citizen and live in North Dakota, you have the right to vote!**

*Anyone who has lived in North Dakota for 30 days prior to an election can vote.*

North Dakota does not require voter registration, but you do need to have a form of identification that can be used for voting. This means you should make sure you have proper identification with you before you go to the polls to vote.

### HOW DO I VOTE?

Find information on where you vote at [vote.nd.gov](https://vote.nd.gov).

- You can vote by **absentee**, or by **mail**.
- You can vote at an **early** voting location.
- You can vote on **Election Day**.

### VOTER IDENTIFICATION

You need one of the following forms of ID to vote:

- **North Dakota Driver's License**
- **North Dakota Non-Driver ID**
- **Tribal ID or Tribal Letter**
- **Long Term Care Certificate**

Identification, tribal government IDs, or documents should have your **name, residential address, and date of birth**.

### CORRECTING ADDRESSES

If you have moved since your ID was issued, you may need to update it before Election Day. The North Dakota Department of Transportation allows you to **update your address** and make **appointments** online for new IDs.
